Core Course: (G2) An Introduction to Political Ideologies

Objectives:

- 1. To introduce the role of different political ideologies and their impact in politics.
- 2. To show the link between political ideas and their realization in public policy.
- 3. To make students aware of the legacy of major ideologies.

Outcomes:

- Students will explain the origin, meaning, and scope of ideology.

DSE: (S1) Western Political Thought

Objectives:

- 1. To acquaint students with major traditions of political thought.
- 2. To highlight diversity of social contexts and philosophical visions.
- 3. To present political thought as interconnected and critical conversations about the good life.

Outcomes:

- Students will describe the key ideas of thinkers such as Plato, Aristotle, Machiavelli, Locke, Rousseau, Hegel, Mill, and Marx.
- They will interpret concepts like justice, liberty, revolution, utilitarianism, and class struggle.
- They will relate classical theories to present-day political challenges.
- They will critically evaluate continuity and change in Western political ideas.

DSE:(S2) Political Journalism

Objectives:

- 1. To introduce the relationship between communication, media, and politics.
- 2. To critically appraise practices of political image management, propaganda, campaigns, and censorship.
- 3. To focus on the Indian context of political journalism.

Outcomes:

- Students will define and explain the nature and scope of political journalism.
- They will identify the role of print, electronic, and digital media in shaping politics.
- They will trace the history of political journalism in India and abroad.
- They will evaluate media's role in elections, party politics, and public opinion.
- They will examine challenges such as paid news, commercialization, and media saturation.

SEC: Basics of Indian Constitution

Objectives:

- 1. To acquaint students with features of the Indian Constitution and framework of government.
- 2. To familiarize students with its functioning.
- 3. To focus on political processes, local influences, and functioning of political system.

Outcomes:

- Students will explain the making of the Indian Constitution and its salient features.
- They will understand Fundamental Rights, Duties, and Directive Principles.
- They will analyze how caste, language, religion, and socio-economic factors influence constitutional functioning.
- They will critically assess the role of the Constitution in strengthening democracy.
